UMW EXECUTIVE COMMITTEE

Duties of the officers include the following:

PRESIDENT

Presides at meetings; appoints committees as well as serving as an ex-officio member of these committees; is the unit's representative in district and annual meetings and encourages all members to participate in these events. Is a member of the local church Administrative Council and shares UMW plans with them. Works with elected officers and helps prepare reports.

VICE-PRESIDENT

Is chairperson of the Program Planning Committee that chooses and implements all programs for the local unit; is responsible for the presentation of local programs; is responsible for the duties of the president in her absence.

SECRETARY

Takes the minutes of the business meeting; mails or e-mails the minutes of business meetings to circle chairmen; sends the names of elected officers to the district secretary; is responsible for setting up and taking down the Chrismon Trees in cooperation with the church Worship Committee; keeps the membership roll; handles general correspondence for the unit.

YEARBOOK SECRETARY

Compiles the yearbook.

TREASURER

In charge of all monies for the local unit; prepares the budget for the following year; makes reports to business meetings; collects pledge money; is cashier for the Garden Sale; sends in gifts to missions (baby memberships, love ribbons, etc.); orders all study materials and magazines; sends all funds, except those designated for mission locally and for local Administration and Membership Development, to the district treasurer.

SECRETARY OF PROGRAM RESOURCES

Publicizes, coordinates, and reports on the Reading Program. Promotes our magazines Response and New World Outlook. Maintains the UMW shelf in the church library.

CHAIR, COMMITTEE ON NOMINATIONS

Presents a slate of officers for the upcoming year at the September Business Meeting and makes nominations to fill vacancies ad interim.

MISSION COORDINATORS

SPIRITUAL GROWTH

Coordinates opportunities for spiritual development related to mission; is responsible for devotions at

special events; coordinates an annual Call to Prayer and Self-Denial program.

EDUCATION AND INTERPRETATION

Works with meeting co-ordinator to keep membership informed of our foreign and national missions and missionaries by use of the prayer calendar, coordinates foreign and national mission projects, promotes School of Christian Mission and other mission studies, works with the Interfaith Council, is UMW representative to Church Women United and coordinates Martha's Kitchen needs through CWU.

MEMBERSHIP NURTURE AND OUTREACH

Works to nurture current membership, to enlist new members, and to recommend ways to increase attendance and participation; plans activities for UMW Awareness Month, including UMW Sunday; plans and coordinates all special membership activities, including the Fall Festival.

SOCIAL ACTION

Promotes social action and participation in current issues and in local missions; plans Rusk Hospital parties; coordinates Thanksgiving flowers with Care Ministry; obtains Pioneer birthday cakes; coordinates Wesley Foundation activities by appointing a chairperson.

MEETING COORDINATOR

Makes telephone calling lists from membership for communications committee; notifies communications committee of UMW meetings and special events; secures persons for hostesses and devotions for forthcoming meetings when the new year's programs are being planned; organizes special needs of members in case of birth, sickness or death; relays information to Care and Concern chairperson when cards need to be sent.

CARE AND CONCERN

Sends cards at difficult times in members' lives.

GARDEN SALE

Appoints all subcommittee chairs; coordinates annual Garden Sale fund-raiser; makes summary report for secretary's records.

Communication Committee - Notifies members of UMW events.

SCRAPBOOK - Maintains the UMW scrapbook

BULLETIN BOARD- Maintains the UMW bulletin board.

HOW FUNDS ARE SECURED FOR MISSIONS

Basic Pledge:

The amount an individual member seriously determines she will give toward the unit's budget. This is the primary source of funds for the local unit and the mission outreach of the Women's Division.

Projects:

Garden Sale is our main fund-raiser.

Special Memberships:

A gift to missions in honor of someone. Several kinds of gifts may be made. The one we are most familiar with is the \$35 gift. A Special Membership may be given to anyone by an individual or group at any time. An appropriate certificate and pin are received by the person so honored.

In Remembrance Gifts:

Any amount in remembrance of a member or a friend who has died.

World Thank Offering:

A "Thanks" for the abundance, for the beauty, for the blessedness God has granted so many. It is an affirmation of the need for us to give so that others may share a little of what we have. This is an ongoing offering through the year and brought in sometime in November.

Result of Study:

An offering taken after a study has been presented.

Love Ribbons:

A way to express love and appreciation for persons and send additional money to missions. These may be used at any time.

A Gift to Missions:

A minimum of \$5 in honor of a child, youth, or adult may be given at any time. This is a good way to honor new babies. A certificate is received by the person honored.

Candle Burning:

To honor those who have served in some special way and in memory of those who have died. The Mission Candle is burned at the Annual Conference Meeting in Lakeview and also at the North District Annual Meeting.

Call to Prayer and Self Denial:

An offering given for the projects or programs in National and World Missions approved by the Women's Division for that observance of the Call to Prayer
